Leah is 17. She is strong, smart, and confident. By now she has probably already started a business or is fighting for some cause she is passionate about.


Zoe is 15. She is still social, happy, and still has that same laugh that lights up an entire room. I imagine she is involved with animals in some way. She has always loved them.
